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



The National Museum in New Delhi is one of the largest museums in India. Established in 1949, it holds variety of articles ranging from pre-historic era to modern works of art. Presently, there are several departments in the National Museum like Pre-History Archaeology, A Manuscripts, Numismatics & Epigraphy, Paintings, Arms & Armour, Decorative Arts, Central Asian Antiquities, Pre-Columbian Art, Jewellery, Anthropology, Education, Public Relations Publication & Conservation. The educational visit ended at 4 p.m with attendance of the students present and group photography. This was indeed a thoroughly learning experience for the students who learnt quite a lot about India's journey from the pre historical period to the modern age.

This includes pen manufacturing, book binding, manure making, screen printing, envelope making, tailoring and cutting, shoe-making etc. which has not only resulted in learning a trade but also provided monetary gains to the prisoners. Lok Adalat is a system of alternative dispute resolution developed in India. It roughly means "People's court". The idea of Lok Adalat was mainly advocated by Justice P.N. Bhagwati, former Chief Justice of India.

The Lok Adalat started at 10:00 am and was inaugurated by Supreme Court judge Honourable Justice A. R. Dave and in the apex court itself, 28 out of 53 cases were settled by three benches.

Justice Dave said it is the best and cheap mode to resolve disputes as both the fighting parties come to a mutually acceptable solution and they do not have to wait for years to get their cases decided in court. The cases which were taken up ranged from family disputes, matrimonial cases, motor accident claims, bank recoveries, petty criminal matters, revenue matters, disbursements under MNREGA and other welfare schemes. Students were very keen to observe the court proceedings and learnt a lot.
