



## Demonetization of Currency

In a major step taken by the government of India, the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on the night of 8th November 2016 announced that the Indian currency of the denominations of Rs 500 and Rs 1,000 will not be operative w.e.f 9th November 2016. While the move is seen to be one major step against the unaccounted black money, it has seen to affect the middle and the lower middle class in the worse possible way. The government on one hand claims that the new currency is in plenty and is also available in the banks but what we the “middle class people” are witnessing and experiencing is a very different picture altogether. What is even disheartening is the fact that when the opposition party points out the shortcomings in this demonetizing policy, the BJP is seen pointing out the “SCAMS” that the other parties have done separately or in conspiracy with some other political party.

The BJP claims that the positive outcomes of the demonetizing policy will favor the country in the long run and it also completes the promise of Mr. Narendra Modi that he will take all possible measures to eradicate black money. The positive step taken by the government is that fact that they have provided certain avenues where the old 500 and 1000 notes can be used. These include petrol pumps, govt. hospitals, pharmacy shops etc. Nobody knows as to what outcome will this policy hold in the long run but what we are witnessing now is not a very good picture. People standing in lines for hours to get their currency notes changed for the new ones, people who have marriages at their place are the worse hit by the policy. There are certain people whose relatives, family members are admitted in the hospital and despite the fact that they have money (in the old form) they cannot spend it for the treatment of their family members.

The only thing that I see will hold back this policy in the long run is the fact that the Indian markets have always been a master at producing and selling duplicate products. This I hope does not hold true in the case of the new currency notes. The policy has acted like a game changer against the black money holders but at the same time the government should have given a thought about the fact that the daily wage workers, vegetable vendors etc are the people who do not even have money to save and in such a harsh circumstance

their earning is affected in a very bad way. The policy is a very good policy against the stop of circulation of black money but that does not overshadow the fact that the policy is affecting the middle class people in a very bad way.
